Loch Duart Shortlisted for the Best Rural Food & Drink Business in UK Award

Loch Duart, the salmon farm based in Sutherland and the Uists, has been shortlisted for the Rural Business Awards North in the Best Rural Food & Drink Business category. Celebrating its 20th year as an independent Scottish salmon farming business Loch Duart has recently launched 'Salmon Pool' a partnership with their fish feed supplier, Cargill Aqua Nutrition. The fund is available to charities and projects providing support to the local community.

Loch Duart salmon is sold to leading hotels, restaurants and retailers at home and abroad and their environmentally sensitive approaches is employed on farms at a number of small sites, some of which have been rearing salmon for over forty years. Since launching in 2018 the Salmon Pool fund has distributed in excess of £31K to over 10 projects. The Rural Business Awards (RBAs) host a series of regional finals in the North, East, Midlands, South East, South West, Wales and Northern Ireland, throughout October and November 2019, ahead of the National Final in February 2020. The North Region Awards Presentation takes place on Friday 11th October 2019 at - The Core, Newcastle University.

The RBAs were established in 2014 by Jemma Clifford and Anna Price – two business owners who work in rural Leicestershire, with the aim of celebrating the achievements of rural businesses and developing a strong network for rural business owners. The first Awards were presented in October 2015 and the RBAs are now entering their 5th year and are held in partnership with Amazon headline partners for the third year running.

Notes to editors

Loch Duart Ltd is an independent Scottish salmon farm based in North West Scotland. Producing around 5,000 tonnes per year, it employs 115 people in the Hebrides and Sutherland. The salmon is supplied to leading hotels, restaurants and retailers at home and abroad.

Loch Duart's unique farming methods include low density farming, a unique rotational fallowing system, swim-throughs and feed from sustainable sources to ensure lean, fit fish. Loch Duart's industry leading innovations include:

- The first fish farm in the world to achieve RSPCA Freedom Food approval.
- Loch Duart's unique strategy of long term rotational fallowing optimised for each sea site according to conditions and fish numbers.
- In 2004, specifying sustainably sourced marine ingredients from traceable, identifiable lots for its salmon feed.
- Inventing a drum filter which can filter sea water down to 100 micron to collect any parasites and their eggs in the heavy water flows taken from the pens.
- In 2015 securing a source of Icelandic fishmeal to enhance the sustainability and quality criteria of Loch Duart's salmon feed.
- Practising 'environmental enrichment' in their fresh water operations to stimulate the young salmon and improve welfare.
